The following announcements were made:

Owsley was the keynote speaker at the fall CAS Conference, and is tentatively scheduled to return to Durango in 2017 to discuss his work at Jamestown and on the Hunley, a Civil War submarine.

Tish Varney announced the upcoming PAAC course on Rock Art Studies, to be held June 3-5 in Durango, taught by Assistant State Archaeologist Kevin Black. No prior classes are required, and the class is open to all, for only \$12.00. See Tish to sign up.

Janice introduced guest Jimbo Buickerood, Public Lands Coordinator for the San Juan Citizen's Alliance. He wanted to let our members know about some upcoming BLM oil and gas leases that may be sold in the HD Mountains, and in the Montezuma Valley right in front of Mesa Verde National Park and near McElmo Canyon. He stressed the need for a BLM Master Leasing Plan to strike a balance that protects our public lands and natural resources and ensures a strong, diverse local economy. A Master Leasing Plan is needed to protect the rich cultural resources in these areas, the water quality and quantity for agricultural and municipal purposes, the wildlife habitat, and to ensure that air and water resources are protected.
