November General Meeting Notes

Janice introduced Jed Smith, recipient of one of our John W. Sanders Internship Fund scholarships. Jed is using the scholarship to manage and store artifacts from a Classic and Pre-Classic Meso-American collection recently donated by John Eton. The collection includes nine groups of figurines, blades, other artifacts, and even a number of books. Managing the collection involves unpacking each box carefully, attaching identification tags to each item, and organizing items for permanent storage. The challenge is to preserve and protect each item, but still make it accessible to scholars and the public.

Janice welcomed four visitors and offered to visit with them about the club after the meeting. Peggy Morris explained the holiday party silent auction and asked for donations. Mark Gebhardt encouraged members to pay their 2015 dues when they mailed payments for the holiday party. Janice announced that SJBAS will host the CAS annual meeting at FLC on October 9th – 11th and that the club would be looking for volunteers to help with the event. Tish Varney described the PAAC questionnaire emailed to members to get their input on prospective courses to be held in Durango. John Viner

won the CAS raffle for yard art pieces which are now happily planted at Animas Crossing. The last field trip of the year is the Winter Solstice Tour at the Ute Mountain Tribal Park on December 13th.

Past president Andrew Gulliford, Ph.D. presented: "Looking for History: Learning to Read the Landscape". Andy passed around a wonderful map from the original Hayden survey showing most of the pueblos before the turn of the century. He purchased the map at the Old Map Gallery in Denver, www.oldmapgallery.com. Then he described the current status and management challenges facing the 1874 Animas Canyon Wagon Road to Silverton that was recently added to the La Plata County Historical Register. Andy read several excerpts from his book, including a story about hiking on Comb Ridge and experiencing the "discovery" of an ancestral Puebloan rock art site; "catch and release" arrowhead hunting; effective land management that doesn't overwhelm the resource values we're trying to protect; and another story "Into the Lion's Cave" about the largest olla ever found in New Mexico. He discussed the culturally modified Ponderosa pine trees that were peeled by the Utes for the rich cambium layers, and presented a number of slides (really, slides!) showing a variety of arboglyphs done by Hispanic shepherders and many examples of recent cowboy history, including line camps that are still in use today.

Andy's New Book

Andrew Gulliford recently won awards in Albuquerque for his new book, ***Outdoors in the Southwest: An Adventure Anthology***, published this year by the University of Oklahoma Press. Out of 1,200 books submitted for the annual New Mexico-Arizona Book Awards, ***Outdoors in the Southwest*** won in two categories. Each finalist had to score 95 out of 100 points, and winners had to score above that.

Gulliford's edited anthology won in the category of Nature/Environment for the 2014 New Mexico-Arizona Book Awards, and was also winner for Best Book published on Arizona for the 2014 New Mexico-Arizona Book Awards. Research for the book was supported by the Fort Lewis College Foundation, the Ballantine Family Foundation, the Charles Redd Center at Brigham Young University, and by a sabbatical courtesy of the FLC Board of Trustees. The book is being used on campus in both wilderness and English classes.

Jane Dillard Looks Back on Four Years of Excavation Her Research Involvement Will Continue in the Lab


